

The Krazy Kilometre

This event started just before half term and involves all the children in the school. The idea is similar to *The Daily Mile*, however, instead of running a mile, the children are allotted a 10 minute slot at lunchtimes to run circuits of the new track.

The event is managed by the children of Class 4, who keep a tally of the laps/distance each child has run. The children are doing fantastically well and they will be acknowledged in assemblies when they attain certain distances: 10km, 25km, 50km and 100km.

Well done to everyone taking part and the children who are organising it.

Plastic Prevention

As part of the KS2 *Pollution* topic, the children would like to see how much plastic we use, as a school, at lunchtimes. We will be asking the children and staff (who have packed lunches) to deposit any plastic items that they normally take home and recycle, into

designated containers within the lunch hall. These items will then be washed, sorted and weighed by the KS2 children. Yogurt pots from children having school lunches will also go into the containers. This will take place each lunchtime next week.

The children have been informed about the event and have been briefed as to what can and cannot go into the containers.

Once we have ended the week's collection, and we have a final figure, the school community will be informed of the findings. As a follow up to this, the children will think of ideas of how the school could help reduce this amount. So please, if any children have pack-ups, continue to furnish them in your usual way. Thank you.
