As you may be aware, our curriculum, across the Federation, is underpinned by Focus Education. We have an enquiry-based approach and work in a very cross-curricular way (wherever possible). To further strengthen our curriculum, forward thinking, we have purchased access to some new resources from Focus. Over the next year, we will be reflecting on our current topics, questions and resources, and potentially adding in new and exciting questions and resources e.g. Year 1 History: Why do we have castles? Year 6 History: What has been the impact of immigration on Britain over the past 100 years? Year 1 Geography: Why do we recycle? Year 4 Geography: What are biomes and how are they created?

**Bugs in School @Bugthorpe @Sutton**

As you are probably aware, we have had a sickness bug going around (this has also been reported as being a problem in the national news). The NHS state that the number of norovirus patients in hospital was almost triple the amount from the previous year ([link here](#)). However, we have also seen signs of a potential virus going around, which is making some children feel sick, without being sick. Just to reassure you, just like in Covid times, we are maintaining the following procedures in school:

- Children asked to wash hands with liquid soap and water when they come in to school, after breaktimes, before eating and at the end of the school day.
- Staff are cleaning frequent touch points and key areas at lunchtimes.
- Deep cleans from our cleaning team.
- We submit our attendance data and infectious diseases information to the Local Authority, who closely monitor numbers, and provide us with support and guidance when required.

Please be reassured that attendance numbers are picking back up again and there is no cause for keeping your children off school.
