Uganda Update 5.3.24 @Bugthorpe @Sutton

An update from Professor Katie:

I am delighted to introduce Fridah and Paddy (photos attached!). Fridah and Paddy worked very hard at Nyabyeya Primary School and both got a brilliant 1st division passes (the best) in their Primary Leaving Exams. Thanks to the amazing fundraising efforts at Sutton and Bugthorpe, both Paddy and Fridah have just started Senior 1 at Kinyara Secondary school. Your fundraising and donations have paid for boarding school fees for Fridah, the only girl to obtain a firstgrade pass in her class. Is this an amazing and life changing opportunity for Fridah. The headmaster identified Paddy as coming from a vulnerable family with no external sources of income, meaning that he needed not just boarding fees covering, but also the long list of requirements students need to start boarding (e.g. mattress, sheets, blankets, washing equipment, domestic uniform, toothpaste, soap,

books, paper, pens). Through running fundraising cafes in Newton-upon-Derwent, we have managed to cover Paddy's boarding fees for this term, but he was still unable to take his place as he couldn't afford the requirements he needed to join boarding school. So we used some of the money you raised last term to buy those items for him, and we will continue to support him by buying things that get used and need replacing each term. So it is only with your help that his dreams of staying in education have come true. The headmaster has sent his appreciation and thanks for all the fundraising that has enabled Fridah and Paddy to start secondary school - not only does it inspire the students at Nyabyeya Primary to work hard to attain the best grades, it gives the whole community hope. I am looking forward to sharing regular updates with you on how Fridah and Paddy are getting on at their new school, so we get to know them as they complete their secondary school journey. We still have more money to raise over the coming years to be able to support Fridah and Paddy through to the end of Senior 4, where they will take their O-levels, or maybe beyond to realise their current dreams of becoming doctors, so I'm excited to see what new fundraising ideas we can come up with!
