School Uniform Reminder

Thank you for providing black school shoes for children to wear during the school day. Agora – Online payments

Thank you to everyone that pays money to school using this system, it really helps us out especially

now as it is getting more difficult to pay cash (especially coins) in at the Post Office. If you still haven't signed up to the system and would like to, please see Mrs Sunderland and she will provide you out with a code for doing so. Could we please ask that when paying on Agora that you select the correct heading ie: for Music Tuition, After School Club, Dinners & Nursery. Please pay all items individually; don't combine as 1 payment as this complicates the school budget. The system will only ever show you the amount owed for dinners up to the day they are inputted. The other sections will show 0.00 as they are not linked electronically, so please just pay the amount shown on your bill. Thank you so much.



Home Time Confusion

The teachers have asked that parents let them know when arrangements for collecting your

children are different from normal at home time. We have had a number of cases where parents say they are taking other children home, but the other parent has not let school know of this change collection from school. For in safeguarding reasons we are not allowed to let children go home with other people unless we have been informed. The children will be kept at school if they are booked into After School Club or will be sent home as normal unless we have been informed.

What have you done today...?


At school we develop positive, polite, caring, team-spirited and accomplished children
