Lottery Work Complete and New Staffroom/Library @Sutton

We are delighted with the work completed at Sutton by Ground Designs, spending our Lotttery Bid money. They have created a sheltered area in Class 1's outdoor area – this will enable outdoor play in all weathers. The reflection shelter on the field has had a facelift to ensure it is sturdy again. We have 3 new, recycled plastic picnic benches and a new fun trial with a rolling log obstacle! The same team installed a fantastic new Mile Track, around our school grounds. This will enable us, in the future, to access the field all year around (avoiding the boggy areas). It also links directly to our school vision — following your pathway with confidence. I'm not entirely sure I am 'confident' enough yet to master the rolling log obstacle though!

Thanks to Yorkshire Garden Rooms for finishing our new staffroom and library building. It looks fantastic and I can't wait to use it properly when it is safe to do so.
