Lockdown 3 - Email sent this week if you missed it @Sutton @Bugthorpe

Dear Parents/Carers,

I wanted to email you concerning our Home / Remote Learning Offer.

As you know we have developed our Home Learning offer for this Lockdown, with the daily Live Lessons via Zoom, and also running the same curriculum for the children at home as those in school. Our aim is to attempt to build on the sense of connection between school and home and to reduce the risk of the children losing what they have learnt in the last term.

However, here are a few things to bear in mind...

- 1) The first and most important outcome of this situation is that we all survive (physically and mentally) this pandemic!
- 2) Most of the children caught up most of their missed learning last term so we can catch them up again.
- 3) There is more to child development than academic attainment and improving one's knowledge.

These statements are not an excuse for us all to not try to help children continue their learning over Lockdown, or allowing the children to do no learning during the next six or more weeks. However, we need to strike a balance for us all.

The Home Learning is there to support you and your children to learn at home whist we get this virus under control, so if you do not log on to every lesson, or they do not fit with your work / home learning schedule all the time, then please do not stress. If you need the children to engage in BBC lessons for a day or so, or work on Tapestry (EYFS) or Seesaw (Y1-6) or you all need to go for a walk during the day then that is okay. To be honest it is probably better than okay, if trying to keep to the timetable and log on each time is going to cause you and your children to be overly stressed.

Also, there might be a problems that arise with the technology so if you log on and you are not admitted or there is a sound or video problem etc then please just log off, have a look at the work on Tapestry and Seesaw and go for it. Do not stress, no need to ring the school or email, just breathe and do what you think is right for your child and have a go at the daily work or an alternative.

We won't get it right all of the time but we will always try our absolute best to serve our children and community. This is why we have acted on feedback and have provided a timetable for Remote Learning with Live Lessons. Timings were chosen based on the fact that some families have children in two/three classes so we didn't want any overlaps. If you can't attend a session, do not stress. There will also be remote learning including videos etc on Tapestry and Seesaw. If you need any support with Remote Learning, do not hesitate to contact your Class Teachers via Tapestry (EYFS) and Seesaw (Years 1-6).

On another note, in the words of Craig David, Schools were safe on Sunday, open on Monday, closed on Tuesday and it's only Thursday.

Yesterday, Gavin Williamson (Secretary of State for Education) suggested that if parents aren't happy with

online learning then they should report this to Ofsted.

My preference would be to contact me first so that I can attempt to address any concerns. My staff would prefer this too! They have worked incredibly hard; not just this week, but over the past 9 months trying to prepare for the eventuality of another Lockdown. Personally, I think they have done, and are doing a fantastic job ... but I'm obviously biased.

They have developed online learning, trained children, created new teaching plans and new communication systems...all in such a short space of time. If this is not good enough ... I'd like to hear it first so I can resolve any problems.

I reiterate, please contact our School Offices, preferably **via email** (as the phone may not be answered) if you have any concerns (preferably before calling Ofsted as that's not a very pleasant thing to do really).

If anyone needs support, you are not alone; we are here for you and will do our best to support you in whatever way we can.


