Could you be eligible for Free School Meals?

@Bugthorpe @Sutton

Everyone's situation at home is different, and sometimes changes in your circumstances can lead to you needing some additional support – particularly with the impact COVID-19 has had on the economy and jobs. Claiming free school meals for one child could save you over £400 per year, and for every pupil in a primary school receiving free school meals the government gives the school an additional £1,320 a year, known as the Pupil Premium grant. We can use this for a range of things, including helping your child in school, with the cost of music tuition, trips etc. There is no stigma attached to this for your child which is one reason some people hold back – children are not aware of each other's circumstances and at no point does anyone know that another child is in receipt of free school meals. Currently, every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a universal free school meal regardless of the family income, but not all will be eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant. To qualify for free school meals and the Pupil Premium grant (or currently just the Pupil Premium grant for Reception and KS1) you must fulfil one of the following criteria: -

- Receive income support/income based job seekers allowance or income related employment and support allowance;
- Be entitled to child tax credit but not receiving working tax credit and your annual income must be below the government set threshold;
- Receive support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999;
- Receive the guaranteed credit element of pension credit;
- Be entitled to the 4 week run of working tax credit due to employment ending.

Reading at Home @Bugthorpe @Sutton

Just a general message about the importance of listening to your child read. It is vital for children to be listened to read at least 4-5 times per week. Not only listening to them read, but sharing books with them too. Studies suggested that even children up to the age of 11 should be listening to stories at home to develop their vocabulary and comprehension. Please make sure you record any reading in your child's reading record. Thank you for your continued support with this.

Reading Recordswhat do I write?

Let the teacher know how your child has got on ...

- · What sounds can they recognise?
- · What words could they blend?
- · What tricky words can they read on sight?
- · Did they find anything difficult?
- What did you talk about? Plot, characters etc.
