#### Time Capsule from 1996! @Bugthorpe

Twenty-five years ago, Bugthorpe CE Primary School created a time capsule to be opened in 2021! We have had the great pleasure of opening it and exploring what was left for us to find.



Our classes have enjoyed looking in magazines from 1996 as well as a shopping catalogue; the desktop computers back then cost around £1700-1999! We found the following, interesting information:

- The latest Ofsted Report (28 pages long!), where the school were judged to be 'Good'.
- The school dinner menu, which included flans, lots of pies and a host of sausages.
- Photographs of all the pupils and staff.
- Catalogues and magazines.
- Information about school trips to Eden Camp and Royal Armouries in Leeds.
- Sports reports: Bugthorpe played 25 football matches in 1995-96, and went as far as Naburn.

- Pocket games including things found in cereal and crisp packets.
- A map of the village including where all the pupils lived etc.

We invited into school, Mr Jones, who taught Year 5/6 at the time. We held a special assembly and asked him lots of questions to find out more. The months ahead will be exciting as we will look to gather items to go into the next time capsule, which will be opened in 2047!
