The following messages are for **Sutton**:

Covid-19 Cases @Sutton

A letter went out this week to children in Classes **1, 2 + 3** to state that cases of Covid are rising, and children need to do **daily 7-day Lateral Flow Device Testing (LFD)** as the new government guidance applies to all contacts of a positive case (any variant and asymptomatic) who are:

- Fully vaccinated adults – two doses of vaccine, plus 14 days since last dose
- All children aged five to 18 years and six months, regardless of their vaccination status
- People who can prove they are unable to get vaccinated for clinical reasons
- People taking part, or have taken part, in an approved clinical trial for the COVID-19 vaccine.

****Under-fives** are exempt from self-isolation as a contact and do not need to take part in daily LFD tests, however it is at the parents' discretion and if the pupil can tolerate the test, they can also daily test.

As a school we strongly recommend this, because if our cases rise, we will have to revert to online learning, which we are trying to avoid.

It is worth noting from our [Outbreak Management Plan](#), following the latest guidance from Public Health and the DFE, that if we were to be deemed an 'outbreak' and in need of a 'circuit-breaker', we may have to close, even for Critical and Key Workers.

*****UPDATE*** Class 1 has closed due to a high level of cases in staff and pupils. This will be reviewed on Thursday 20th January, with a view to the children returning on Friday 21st January. Siblings are allowed in school, as per the government guidance; however, as a school, we recommend to do a lateral flow test before attending each morning, just to be sure (and to keep everyone as safe as possible). Thank you for your support as we navigate this difficult time.**

Our School Lottery @Bugthorpe



Here's some more information on the School Lottery from our PTFA:

Each ticket costs £1, 40p of this is put towards school and the remaining 60p gets divided between prizes (36%) and administration (24%).

The money gets paid directly into the FOBs account each month.

One winner from school each week will win our school prize which currently sits at **£10.50**. Each ticket also gets entry into the national jackpot prize of **£25,000**.

We've currently got 37 tickets in play and 23 people playing. We've raised **£1224** to date since Feb 2020. Winners can choose to have their prize paid directly back into their bank account or they can donate it to school.
