Some children are talking about a character they are watching on YouTube called 'Huggy Wuggy'. The creature has long arms, legs and rows of sharp teeth.

Although the name seems harmless, it is a video which talks about death and whispers horrible things in your ear when giving hugs. They also sing songs, some of the lyrics are 'I could hug you here forever, til your breathe your last breath' and 'My teeth sharp and ready, in my grasp yeah they're deadly'.

Due to its name, 'Huggy Wuggy' is able to get through blocks at home and YouTube's own filtering system.


There are reports online that content can cause anxiety and nightmares among children.

Please make sure that you are aware of what your children are watching, that you challenge any behaviours and discuss if the name arises.



Hearing Dog Ambassador Beck has been helping out at Sutton upon Derwent School since November 2021. Beck was invited to the school to tell the children all about Hearing Dogs for Deaf People after they had kindly raised



money for the charity. Mrs Stephenson then asked if Beck could come into the school on a regular basis to listen to children read. He literally jumped at the chance to be involved!



Since then he has visited on alternate Thursday afternoons and has listened to lots of readers. Feedback from the children has been very positive – they really enjoy

- 1. Children had a good knowledge of all the books they have been learning about and reading. They wanted



to see more non-fiction books used. Classes are reminded that we have the Library Service books available each term, which the PTFA fund, which contain lots of non-fiction books to look at. The children thought that the gender of the character didn't matter if it was a good storyline.

- 2. Children suggested a theme of 'food from around the world', which I think is a lovely idea for some themed days in the future. Lots of children suggested a move to a sandwich/wrap/baguette option available in the summer term. This is something we are looking into. We have put in place the Themed Thursday, where classes chose the menu for that day. They want to bring back pink custard!
- 3. The children would like a park in school © They would like more bird boxes and bird feeders. They would like to see benches on the school fields.
- 4. We had some really interesting questions, including: Do you learn gardening? Do you walk a long way to get to school? If you do something wrong, what are the consequences? What is your favourite thing to do at home?

provide seconds for KS2 children, if any food is left. We are also looking into a salad bar option with cold pasta. The children wanted to invite families in to school to share a meal; we are looking at getting some dates together for this.
