Welcome Back! @Bugthorpe @Sutton

Apologies that this is a long Newsletter, but it is packed with important messages to hit the ground running in 2023-24.

SIAMS and Collective Worship @Bugthorpe @Sutton

Following a postponement last school year, **@Bugthorpe** will have their SIAMS Inspection **imminently** – seeing how our vision is lived out as a church school. This will be an opportunity, like with Ofsted, for our school to celebrate all the good that we do in enabling our children to 'Follow their pathway and grow with confidence'. **@Bugthorpe's** vision is

based on Matthew – the Parable of the Sower; we grow in the good soil – at Bugthorpe.

As a church school, our vision is the most important part of us and it tells you 'who we are' and 'how we live'. Every decision we make should focus on our school visions and it needs



to be lived out and not 'laminated'. Our school signs (Sutton's pictured above) help the children to remember what we are striving to achieve; we treat all children as unique individuals made in God's image, and passionately want our children to 'follow their pathway' in life and to 'grow with confidence', whilst in our loving school families. Proverbs (Sutton) teaches us that if you guide a child down the right path, they will continue to follow it when they are older, and will contribute positively to society. Matthew (Bugthorpe) shows us that the seeds will only grow and flourish in the correct environment, with God's help. This too links to the right 'pathway' in life – the best place to grow and develop.

At Bugthorpe and Sutton upon Derwent C of E Federation, we want all our children to thrive and flourish and have a love of life. The Church of England's Vision for Education is based on John 10:10 – living life in all its fullness. We certainly believe our own school visions compliment this. Confidence, certainly helps play its part along the journey.

Our Collective Worship theme for this half term is 'Thankfulness'. In our thoughts will be our link school in Uganda, and how we can further develop our links and support Nyabyeya Primary to flourish. We are proud that in 2022-23 we raised funds to put in place a school librarian, provided resources for exam papers to be copied (to give the pupils the best chance to succeed

and potentially reach secondary education) and, some of our families, sponsored children to board at secondary school.



Curriculum Update for 2023-24 @Bugthorpe @Sutton

When I first started in September 2019, the schools didn't have a planned curriculum past Christmas! Sutton's Class 3 taught 'rivers' for 15 weeks solid. We launched our enquiry curriculum in January 2020 but some classes weren't aligned. This year, both schools are going to be working on Year A, enabling staff to plan together, share resources and potentially go on school trips together. The new school minibus will enable classes to visit each other to work together on their learning too. However, Class 2 and 3 at Sutton have a slightly different topic plan for this year.

Class Topic PowerPoints @Bugthorpe @Sutton

In the past, at the start of each half term, the Class Teachers have shared a 'class curriculum newsletter' with you, which highlighted what subjects the children will be learning this half term.

This year, we are moving towards creating 'class topic PowerPoints', which will showcase and reflect on all the learning and activities we have completed. Obviously, these will be shared at the end of a half term, with pictures and examples of work to share what your children have been doing. We will be able to utilise these PowerPoints in our parent sharing assemblies on Fridays.

Therefore, this week, your Class Teacher will send home a 'slide', which highlights what we are learning in Autumn 1 2023.



Communication from Teachers @Bugthorpe @Sutton

In support of any new parents joining our loving school families, below is some information regarding class communication for you:

You should have received a first 'PowerPoint slide' this week, which gives you a flavour for what the class will be learning over the half term ahead. Along with this, (in Classes 2/3/4) and linking with certain topics, you will be sent home a 'knowledge mat'. This will provide you with the key vocabulary and 'sticky knowledge' that the children need to learn for their topic – a useful tool to support your child with learning at home. Every few weeks, the Teachers will hold mini quizzes, in Classes 2, 3 and 4, linked to the children's knowledge mats. These will be marked by the children themselves (and scores will not be shared) – an opportunity to selfassess what they have learnt about their new topic. The quizzes will be used to promote the building of 'sticky knowledge' and vocabulary. Some example questions for Year 3/4 from this knowledge mat on rivers would be:

What is the start of a river called? What is the longest river in the world? What does meander mean?

Class Dojo – For a number of years, we have used Tapestry in Class 1 (Nursery and Reception) for home school communication in the Early Years. This has been a vital tool for sharing what your child has been up to in school, and for parents to also upload observations from home to support your child's learning journey.

This school year, we are moving to the use of Class Dojo, in line with the rest of school. We can still share in the same way, adding to the 'Class Story' as well as to your child's individual folder. Parents are able to communicate with the Class Teacher via Class Dojo too, as well as see what team points your child has been earning ⁽³⁾

In Classes 2-4, we will continue to use it in the classroom, where the children will be able to take photos of their work and share it with their parents to

answer 'how was school today? What did you learn?' questions at the dinner table.

Please can all parents, in all classes, ensure that they 'connect' with Class Dojo so you don't miss out on updates/messages/information

NB: New parents will be added to Class Dojo this week, so please look out for an email in your junk folder if it doesn't appear in your inbox.

The children should receive passwords for a range of **online learning tools** – most are stuck into our reading records or homework diaries. Key Stage 1 children should receive Teach Your Monster to Read passwords, along with Sumdog, Times Table Rockstars and SPAG.com in Key Stage 2.

Please contact your class teacher if you are missing any of these via Class Dojo, or in the playground, before or after school.

Reading at Home @Bugthorpe @Sutton

Just a general message, at the start of the school year, about the importance of listening to your child read. It is vital for children to be listened to read at least 4-5 times per week. Not only listening to them read, but sharing books with them too. Studies suggested that even children up to the age of 11 should be listening to stories at home to develop their vocabulary and comprehension. Please make sure you record any reading in your child's reading record, which you should have received this week. Thank you for your continued support with this.

Reading Recordswhat do I write?

Let the teacher know how your child has got on ...

- What sounds can they recognise?
- What words could they blend?
- What tricky words can they read on sight?
- Did they find anything difficult?
- What did you talk about? Plot, characters etc.

School Development Priorities for 2023-24 @Bugthorpe @Sutton

Big Writes have certainly helped the teaching team assess who is demonstrating writing skills independently. However, writing at length has been highlighted as an area for development in 2023-24; we need to dedicate at least one day a week to writing at length. Children need to increase the amount of application of Spelling, punctuation and grammar. Slow writing could be used to aid this i.e. sentence 1 – can you use an expanded noun phrase? Sentence 2 – can you use a

subordinating conjunction? Sentence 3 – can you use a rhetorical question? This will also add challenge for children and improve their editing and improving skills.

- Self and peer marking we need to really make more of a focus on this in class. One it reduces teacher workload, regarding marking, but two, it enables the children to learn how to spot what is good about a piece of work and highlight what they need to work on.
- Continue with fortnightly staff meetings, with the second week allowing teachers to meet with their phase from the other school e.g. Class 1 teacher at Sutton meets with the Class 1 teacher at Bugthorpe to discuss resources, planning, ideas and 'check in' with one another.
- Marketing continue to promote and raise the profile of the Federation in the local area. Work to create a Federation website with webpages for each school, merging our websites into one.
- Use of Federation Minibus expand the curriculum for the children by utilising the minibus for local visits and trips. Market the Federation in local communities by expanding our litter picking empire.
- Continue parental engagement with planned curriculum days. Class 1 already do sessions like Teddy Picnic and Muddy Maths. Class 3 at Bugthorpe have done a Mediterranean Café. Ensure each class plan in and invite parents to join them for curriculum enrichment sessions.
- SIAMS Children to be more involved in the planning of Collective Worships. Children to be given the theme and some ideas, and then to work together to plan worship, following our structure in our policy. This will further develop their responsibility and ownership.
- Aim for some fully child-led Collective Worships in 2023-24.
- Classes to complete a shared letter to their counterparts in Uganda so that we can create a written dialogue with them. Similar to a 'pen pal' system. Children to share information about what topics we are learning about and to compare and contrast to the curriculum in Nyabyeya.
