

National Tests @Bugthorpe @Sutton

Best wishes to our Year 6 children at both schools,

who will sit their SATS tests on Tuesday 9th May til Friday 12th May. Our Year 2 children also have their SATS tests within the month of May, but this is only to inform Teacher Assessment. Year 1 will complete their Phonics Screening Check in June: Schools have the freedom to choose a day within the week commencing 12th June 2023.

Regarding the Year 1 and 2 tests, as some schools are larger than others, the tests can take place on one day or across several days.

Before their SATS tests, the Year 6 children will be invited into their class, from arrival at 8:45am, to help them settle and prepare for the test.



Please ensure they get a good night sleep and breakfast before school so that they have the best start. Thanks for your support with this. We are confident everyone will try their best so that they can follow their pathways and grow with confidence.

Collective Worship Theme – Friendship @Bugthorpe @Sutton

This half term we are learning about the theme of friendship. In Collective Worship, we have been discussing the words from the Bible of ‘Encourage one another, and build each other up’. Too often we focus on the negative and criticise others (especially in team games); our challenge this half term, is to encourage each other and offer positive advice and support to help ‘build each other up’.

The Reverend Canon Janet Beadle is a Minster Chaplain, who is currently spending some of her time working with Refugee Action York. Part of the group's work involves teaching refugees to knit and crochet, and Janet says that the ladies are taking to this like ducks to water! Refugee Action would really appreciate any donations of double knitting wool, preferably in either pastel, or fairly bright colours.

The ladies are afforded a small allowance of £15 per week to provide for all their personal needs but have recently had their allocations of free sanitary products withdrawn, meaning they now have to pay for them personally. In the circumstances, donations of this

kind, or any other toiletries you feel you can spare, would be gratefully received.
